REGISTRATION & CHECK-IN

All teams must check in at least one hour prior to their first game at the site of their Age Group Headquarters. Registration packets including instructions and participation pins will be available at the registration check-in locations.

Tournament staff will be on site at all game locations and will wear tournament identification. These staff members will monitor their assigned areas and will be available to assist with tournament questions.

All teams must submit a final tournament roster listing the name, jersey number, and birth date of each player at least one hour prior to their first tournament game. No changes to the roster will be allowed for the remainder of the tournament. Any player on the tournament roster whose information is handwritten must provide proof of age at check-in. No exceptions.

All official team rosters must have the Association or Club Registrar's signature verifying all players have been properly registered with a Youth Soccer Association and are concussion compliant. A medical release form for each player must be carried at the field for every game.

OUT-OF-STATE TEAMS: Teams traveling from outside of Washington state must provide proof of permission to travel.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE: The deadline for entry is June 27, 2019, or until 130 teams have registered. We will continue to accept applications after the deadline date on a space available basis. Any teams that withdraw before June 15, 2019 will receive a refund minus a \$100 processing fee. No refund will be awarded for any teams that withdraw after June 27, 2019.

PLAYER AGE & ELIGIBILITY

Age divisions are applicable to the 2019-2020 Season. Individual players may only be rostered to one team in the tournament.

If there are enough teams for the U17, U18, and U19 age groups, they will have their own divisions. Most years, we have a combined U17/18 bracket and a combined U18/U19 bracket with Gold U18 teams playing with U19 and Silver U18 teams playing with U17 teams.

Most younger divisions will have Gold and Silver Divisions. Please indicate which you prefer.

U10, U11, and U12 will be on approximately 47 x 80 field with smaller goals.

U10 and U11 will use build out lines. No headers are allowed. Goalkeepers cannot punt or drop kick the ball. Offsides is called at the build out line.

GUEST PLAYERS

Each team will only be allowed a maximum of five guest players. We ask that teams not stack their rosters with guest players that play at a significantly higher level than the team on which they are registered. If you have any questions please contact the Tournament Director.

TEAMS

The home team is the team listed first on the schedule. The home team will wear a light colored jersey. In the event of a color conflict, the home team is responsible for changing jerseys. The visiting or away team will wear a dark colored jersey. All teams are encouraged to have an alternate jersey.

SIDELINE REGULATIONS: Players and Coaches must be on one side of the field and remain two yards behind touch line and not within 18 yard of end lines. Spectators on the other side. Only those listed on the approved tournament roster may be on the teams side of the field with limit of three coaches/trainers.

LAWS OF THE GAME

All matches must be played in accordance with FIFA Laws of the Game and Washington Youth Soccer Operating Document Rules of Competition.

Games will have a five-minute halftime. No overtime. If tied, championship games will go straight to a penalty kick shootout.

PLEASE NOTE: If the start time of a game is more than 20 minutes behind schedule, the referee will inform the coaches that the game time will need to be shortened 5 minutes for each half. This will not apply to championship games.

SUBSTITUTIONS: Either team, with consent of the referee, may make unlimited substitutions during any stoppage of play.

PLAYER EQUIPMENT: Uniforms need to have same color shirts. Numbers are recommended but not mandated. No equipment shall be worn that is dangerous to another player. Casts constructed of hard materials are permitted if padded sufficiently to the referee's discretion. All equipment is subject to approval by the referee. No jewelry of any kind (earrings, nose rings, body rings, bracelets, necklaces) is permitted. Taping of jewelry is not permitted (with the exception of medical bracelets. Medical bracelets are allowed and must be taped. Hair retention items must be made of soft, flexible material.

GAME BALLS: The Tournament will supply one game ball for each game. Each team will provide a back-up ball approved by referee.

TOURNAMENT AND MATCH SCHEDULES

The first match of the tournament will commence on Friday at 8:30 am and the last game will be completed by 5:00 PM on Sunday. Saturday and Sunday start times will begin at 8:30 am. The tournament committee understands that some teams may have players who have to travel longer distances to meet game times. The tournament committee will make every effort to take this into consideration when scheduling. Special requests may be granted on a case by case basis especially for coaches who are coaching multiple teams. Please indicate information on application.

BRACKET FORMAT: Every team will be scheduled for a minimum of four games except for U10 which will have a 3 game Jamboree. Each team will play 3 pool matches on Friday and Saturday (no more than 2 games in one day). Top two will play in Championship Match. Others will play for 3rd/4th, 5th/6th, etc. There maybe more than one division at any age group depending on number of entries. Some age groups may be combined but every effort will be made not to do this.

TOURNAMENT SEEDING: Teams will be placed in brackets based on their team's history in leagues, tournaments and coaches request. Recommendation is for Rec Teams in Silver and Select teams in Gold.

SCORING AND TIE-BREAKERS

Win 6 points

Draw 3 points

Loss 0 points

Goals 1 point per goal, up to 3 maximum

Shutout 1 point for holding opponent scoreless (0-0 draw will result in each team earning 4 points)

* No scores will be kept for the U10 age group as a jamboree format will be followed.

TIE-BREAKERS:

1. Head-to-head competition
2. Fewest goals allowed
3. Goal differential in all games (max of 3 per game)
4. Most number of wins
5. Coin toss

MATCH AND SCORE REPORTING: Referee's will turn in game cards after the match. Coaches should verify the score with the referee at completion of match.

FORFEITS: Teams not ready to play with at least 5 players 5 players for U10, 6 players U11 and U12 and 8 players for U13 and Up by 10 minutes after the scheduled start time will forfeit the match. This circumstance will result in a 0-1 loss for the team that was required to forfeit.

TERMINATED PLAY BY REFEREE: If in the opinion of the game officials, game play must be terminated for misconduct of the coach, players and or spectators, the offending team will be charged with a 0-3 loss.

PROTESTS & DISPUTES

No protests will be allowed and all referee decisions will be final. Yes, referee errors are made, but for the sake of tournament play, there will be NO protests or overruling of calls made by the referee staff during games.

The Judiciary/Disciplinary Committee will settle all disputes.

CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE BEHAVIOR: Coaches are responsible for the behavior of their players, parents and fans. Lack of control by either, or both, teams can result in match forfeiture and possible disqualification from the tournament. Any player or coach sent off will be disqualified for the remainder of the match and will be suspended from the next match. The Tournament Judicial Committee may render additional disqualification. Issuance of red and yellow cards will be recorded and reported to the home state association and club/league of the person(s) involved, except that all matters involving referee assault shall, in accordance with USSF 1108, be referred immediately to WSYSA. The home state association or club/league may choose to impose additional penalties on the persons involved.

CAUTIONS (Yellow Cards) & SEND OFFS (Red Cards): Any player receiving two yellow cards or one red card in a game will be sent off from the game. If upheld by the Disciplinary committee, said player(s) will be disqualified for the next match. A player accumulating three yellow cards during the tournament may have to sit out the next scheduled game. All red cards may result in further disqualification and or elimination from further play in the tournament. All yellow and red cards affect this tournament only. However, the respective state, provincial or national office of the disciplined team or player will be notified.

REPORT OF DISCIPLINARY ACTION:

For United States teams, the Tournament Disciplinary Committee will notify the Federation Organization Member of that team of the disciplinary action taken or required. For International teams, the Tournament Disciplinary Committee will notify the US Soccer Federation of the action(s) taken, and the Federation will transmit the disciplinary action taken or required to that team's provincial or national organization.

GAME BALLS

The Tournament will supply one game ball for each game. Each team will provide a back up ball approved by referee.

FIELD RULES

Absolute no food or sugary drinks on turf fields, no animals (except service dogs), alcoholic beverages, smoking or verbal abuse of anyone at any field. Please use recycle bins and leave no garbage. All field rules are subject to additional local rules.

Petrovitsky Park: Only Coaches and Players inside fence and in middle

Wilson Fields: Field 1A and 1B, all parents in middle, Field 2 Players and coaches on Westside

Wilson 3 = players and coaches only on Eastside

Kentridge HS – Players and coaches on Eastside

Kentwood HS – Only players and coaches inside fence

Lindbergh HS – Only Players inside Fence

Maple View MS - Only Coaches and player allowed in field area, spectators in stands only

Tahoma HS – Only Coaches and player allowed in field area, spectators in stands only

All parents and spectators on opposite side of field than players and coaches
